The Presentation of our Lord Jesus Christ in the Temple, aka “Candlemas”

Sunday, February 2nd marks forty days after Christmas Day. On this day Mary was required by Jewish law to present herself at the Jerusalem Temple for purification, as well as presenting Jesus, the first-born male in the family, before the priests. (*Lev. 12:2-8*)

According to the account of Luke 2:22-39, the presentation of Jesus was also the occasion of the meeting of Jesus with Simeon and Anna. Simeon's prayer of blessing is the basis for the canticle *Nunc dimittis*, which were the words Simeon proclaimed when he beheld Jesus.

The Song of Simeon *Nunc Dimittis*

Lord, you now have set your servant free *
to go in peace as you have promised;
For these eyes of mine have seen the Savior, *
whom you have prepared for all the world to see:
A Light to enlighten the nations, *
and the glory of your people Israel.



The Celebration of the feast dates from the fourth century in Jerusalem. It was introduced in Rome in the seventh century, where it included a procession with candles and the singing of the *Nunc dimittis*. The celebration came to include the lighting and blessing of candles which were carried in procession. This feast is also known as “Candlemas.” Join us on February 2nd, when we will celebrate Candlemas at the 10:30 a.m. service by blessing candles and a special procession to honor this feast of our Lord.

Once a month, a healing service is offered at 9:30 a.m. in the Chapel for anyone who would like to ask prayers for themselves or others. The service lasts about 30 minutes and will be led by a Lay Eucharistic Visitor. Join us for this quiet, yet powerful service.

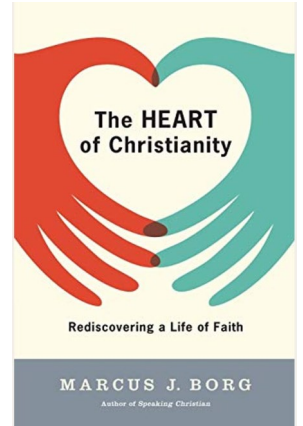

The Heart of Christianity: Rediscovering a Life of Faith by Marcus Borg

Join us for the final two discussions on re-discovering a life of faith as a Christian.

“World-renowned Jesus scholar and author of the bestseller *Meeting Jesus Again for the First Time* argues that the essential ingredients of a Christian life—faith, being born again, the kingdom of God, the gospel of love—are as vitally important today as they have always been, even during this time of conflict and change in the church. Borg wants to show us, as today's thinking Christians, how to discover a life of faith by reconceptualizing familiar beliefs. Being born again, for example, has nothing to do with fundamentalism, but is a call to radical personal transformation. Talking about the kingdom of God does not mean that you are fighting against secularism, but that you have committed your life to the divine values of justice and love. And living the true Christian way is essentially about opening one's heart—to God, and to others. Above all else, Borg believes with passion and conviction that living the Christian life still makes sense.”

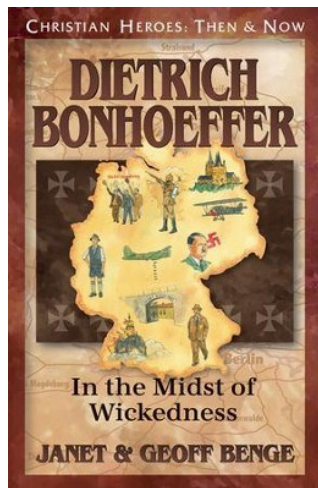

“Born into a loving family, Dietrich Bonhoeffer pursued a life as a pastor, teacher, theologian -- and spy. He spoke out about the trouble in Germany when Adolph Hitler came to power, urging the Christian church to rescue disparaged people groups and resist Hitler's evil empire. Accused of being a troublemaker, Dietrich continued on fearlessly in the midst of wickedness. His work as a spy in the German resistance and participation in a plot to assassinate Hitler led to imprisonment and eventual execution. But the lesson of his life story remains: "Not to speak is to speak. Not to act is to act.”

Friends,

Last month I hosted a webinar for the Association of Anglican Musicians (AAM). AAM is a professional organization for church musicians in the Episcopal Church. My current role is the Chair of the Lay Professional Advocacy Committee (LPAC), which is an advocacy committee for church musicians at General Convention. The webinar was an interview with The Rev. Gay Clark Jennings, the past President of the House of Deputies for the Episcopal Church. In this webinar, Gay talked about the history of polity in the Episcopal Church from our founding until now. During our conversations, one thing that struck me was Gay's emphasis on lay leadership in the church. She talked about the importance of lifting everyone up in the church and how our baptismal covenant holds all of us accountable to see God in every human being. The whole interview was so inspirational.

One of the reasons why I love a strong music ministry is its goal of empowering lay people. I always remind the choirs that their job is to support their fellow choristers in their singing and their stance. We are a family, here to support each other, even when we sing a wrong note. The same can be said of flower guild and altar guild: many people come together, using their God-given gifts to make an expression of great love. It doesn't matter what our differences are, we are all there for the same purpose: to praise God. That is living out our baptismal covenant. That is why taking leadership in the church is so important, we are there to serve others as Christ serves us each day.

This month our Young Choristers are going to be busy with singing not one, but two Evensongs! Wednesday, February 12th at 6pm the Choristers will sing Evensong at Trinity Cathedral, Cleveland. This is all by themselves, so please support them by coming to the Cathedral to hear their hard work! Later that week they will also sing at TrebleFest, a festival for choristers in similar programs like ours. This year they will be joining the choristers of St. Paul's, Cleveland Heights, and St. James Cathedral, Chicago, to sing Sunday, February 16th, both at the morning Eucharist and 4pm Evensong at St. Paul's, Cleveland Heights. The guest conductor will be Dr. Katie Burk Webb, Canon for Cathedral Music at Trinity Episcopal Cathedral, Portland, OR. Please join us for either of BOTH events!

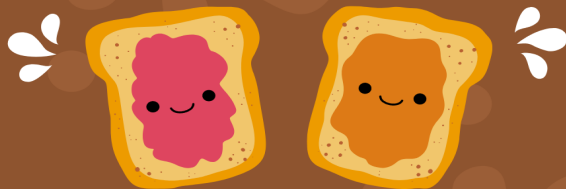


OUTREACH MINISTRY

Get to know Bob & Pam Zuhl

It takes a special person to agree to serve the church as Warden during a challenging time. It takes a very special person to do this **FOUR** times. It also takes a special person to be married to her and to also serve as Warden during an interesting time. Meet Pam and Bob Zuhl!

Pam was our Junior Warden in 2024, helping Senior Warden Greg Daniels to keep the church going after Charlotte’s retirement. She was also Senior Warden in 2001 and served as Junior Warden in 2014 during a difficult time when many of our members left the church. She was Senior Warden again in 2021. We remember the challenges to the world, and Christ Church, in 2021. And now she has helped guide us again in a time of transition. Thank you, Pam!



Thank you, Bob, for supporting her and also for serving on vestry and as Senior Warden in 2018, during the search and the start of Charlotte’s time. Whew! That’s a lot!

Their story begins in Pittsburgh at The Chester Engineers. Pam was a technical writer, with an English degree from Carnegie Mellon. Bob was a civil engineer, from Michigan State. (Have you seen his neckties?) Pam was from Pennsylvania and Ohio; her family attended Methodist and Presbyterian churches. Bob grew up in Michigan and was a Lutheran. They were married in 1979 in a Presbyterian church in Pittsburgh.

They began their life together in Ann Arbor, MI, eventually moving to Seven Hills, OH when Bob took an engineering job with BFGoodrich Chemical. Meanwhile, daughters Elizabeth (1985) and Katherine (1988) were born. A promotion for Bob took the family to a Chicago suburb, and another job change, in 1995, brought the family to Hudson. The girls (now 10 and 7) told Pam that her years of volunteering were fine, but now it was time for her to get a real job. She did...at the Hudson Library...and is still there!

By now, Bob and Pam were looking for a new church home. When they tried Christ Church, they were warmly welcomed by John Krum (former mayor), Charles McKinley, and Julie Micheletti. They quickly became involved, with Pam serving on the vestry and soon becoming Senior Warden. That was in 2001 and the first of her challenging terms.

They continue to be ‘pillars of the church.’ Pam likes to use her writing skills for church purposes. She is a regular chalice bearer, lector, and crucifer at both services. Her ham salad sandwiches and hands-on help are valued at receptions. The knitting group shares her scarves and cotton washcloths with refugees. Meanwhile, Bob is the church’s lighting engineer and does many maintenance chores as needed. He is head of the ushers, a counter, and also works with Habitat for Humanity. They love spending time with their granddaughters, Ella (6) and Hannah (3).

The Zuhls hope that we can achieve a smooth transition with a new rector. They also hope Christ Church continues to be a place of welcome and hospitality for many years to come.

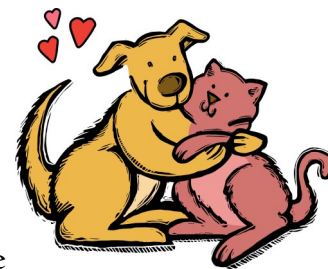

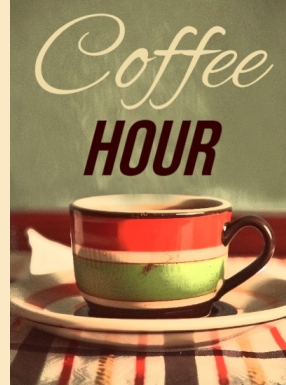

January Vestry Meeting Highlights



- The vestry met on January 28 at 6:30 p.m. after an executive session
- Pam Zuhl, 2024 Jr. Warden, made a motion to nominate Greg Daniels as Sr. Warden. Greg nominated Theresa Edwards for the position of Jr. Warden. Both positions were approved unanimously
- Linda Irving was re-elected to the position of Clerk of the vestry. Ann Kirk was re-elected to the position of Treasurer.
- New vestry members were welcomed and everyone shared advice and insights regarding service on the vestry.
- Vestry approved the updated Key Bank Signature cards, reflecting the change in wardens.
- Continuing with our stewardship theme “We Are the Church,” vestry will focus on “Time and Talent” opportunities at Christ Church. The February Communicant will highlight CCH ministries and options for involvement.
- The vestry will hold off on an in-house vestry retreat in February, instead waiting to hold a retreat once a new rector has arrived.
- Vestry will continue to greet parishioners at the 10:30am service at the main parking lot door instead of the Aurora St. door to help alleviate the congestion at the back of the church.
- Ann Kirk reported that CCH ended 2024 with less than a 3% pledge deficit. Ann will recap the final pledge numbers at the February meeting.
- The next vestry meeting is Tuesday, February 25 at 6:00 p.m.
